Recreation Advisory Board Meeting

Minutes

Monday, August 20, 2018

The Recreation Advisory Board met at the Optimist Park Clubhouse at 6:00pm.

Members present for this meeting were: Scott Barnett, Michael Dineen, Darrell Lipford, Rick Pierce, Erik Rabinowitz, and James Robertson.

Staff members present were: Kenny Story and Maria Swanson.

Absences included: Crissy Thomas, Ex-Officio.

Members were welcomed by Scott Barnett.

Minutes from the April 16, 2018 meeting were reviewed. Motion made accept minute as written by Erik Rabinowitz, second by James Robertson. Motion carried.

Director's Report

- Update on JE Broyhill Park:
 - o New restrooms are complete, currently redoing the parking lot with new curbing and sidewalks, Basketball Court is paved and fencing up, will be putting up backboards and goals in next few weeks.
 - o A \$200,000 Storm Water Management Grant was awarded for the park.
- Broyhill Walking Park: Walk path from Broyhill Family Foundation to walking park parking lot is complete. There are plans in the future to plant small trees and shrubs along the side of the path.
- Optimist Park: We are slowly moving forward with the PARTF Grant project. There has been flood plain/floodway issue to address. Not a major issue, just need permits to proceed.
- Water Fountain Dedication on the Greenway took place in July. Fountain is close to the soccer complex and in memory of Rosemary Marlowe who was an avid walker of the greenway.
- July 4th Event at Mulberry Recreation was successful with an estimated 800-1000 people attending. Five additional porta-johns were placed throughout the mall parking lot to address some complaints from previous years. Police reported that traffic flow was good this year and no major issues arose at festival.
- The Aquatic and Fitness Center has been having a good season despite the usual summer storms and rain. Lots of pool parties are being booked. Swim Lenoir held a swim meet with 191 swimmers and 300-350 people in attendance. This is the largest event held at LAFC.
- The Summer Music Concert Series and Family Movie schedules went well this summer. One final movie for the season is scheduled for Saturday, August 25th.
- Mulberry Rec held Summer Fun Camp the week of July 16th-20th. 25 campers enjoyed daily field trips which included Lazy 5 Ranch, the Hickory Airport, Tuttle State Forest, Bo's and the Aquatic Center.
- MLK Center had a Jazz Show on July 28th and the Harambee Festival the week of August 3rd-10th. There was a good turnout for both events.
- During the Harambee Festival, the meeting room at the MLK Center was named in honor of Sylvia Green, a well-known local artist.
- Fall Soccer registrations have been extended to August 28th. Baseball and Softball registrations are complete and practices began the week of August 20th.
- The 12U and 15U baseball teams represented Lenoir in the Tar Heel League State Tournament held in Hickory in July.
- Mulberry Rec is now offering Pickleball on Monday, Wednesday and Friday mornings from 9-11:30am. We average 2-10 players each day.

- Vandalism was our biggest problems this summer. Trashcan fire on Greenway, fencing around porta-johns damaged, fence at soccer complex cut down, plastic tiles on tennis court pulled up, and B&E at LAFC with van and various tools and equipment stolen.
- New cameras are currently being installed at all facilities to help deter the vandalism.
- Rentals at all P & R facilities have been good.

New Business

- Darrell Lipford was welcomed as a new member of the Rec Advisory Board.
- Joel Kincaid has decided to not renew his term with the board.
- The board is currently in need of 2 members. Applications are available at City Hall - 2nd Floor. The board would like to have more female representation on the board.
- Rick Pierce mentioned Winter Rye Grass for the fields and cost involved. Kenny will get a cost figure for Mack Cook Stadium and report to the board.
- Darrell Lipford mentioned the addition of a youth bowling league. There was one in the past but did not have much interest. Will revisit the idea, see if there is any interest and look into it for the future.
- The sun block dispenser on the Greenway needs to be cleaned. Kenny will check on the dispenser.
- Erik suggested painting the new basketball court the JE Broyhill Park a light color to reduce heat from the asphalt.
- Erik voiced some concerns heard from citizens concerning spring baseball/softball. Concerns were the lack of coaching on some teams and a few children not having as much play time compared to other players. Kenny explained the rules in place would prevent such an occurrence like this from happening but will look into the complaint and address any issues as needed.

Old Business

It was discussed in a previous meeting the need for new task force committees and Kenny Story presented three task force committees he feels will assist in the goals and vision for the recreation department.

- Needs Assessment Task Force – Will need to look at the needs of the city in relation to parks and recreation. New recreation areas, what the citizens want to see in the community, etc.
- Volunteer Recruitment and Retention – Will need to look at ways to get citizens to volunteer for sport programs and activities within the recreation department. What can be done to get good, dedicated volunteers and the need for parent, coach and referee education.
- Community Partnerships – Will need to look for ways to get our community businesses involved in the parks and recreation department through joint events, corporate sponsorships, etc.

We need board members to volunteer to head up these committees. Do we want to wait until we obtain 2 additional members or go ahead and move forward now?

Also discussed in a previous meeting were by-law requirements pertaining to number of board members.

Do by-laws need to be reviewed for compliance for this and other areas as we move forward?

Maps from Planning Department

- Erik mentioned we are still waiting on maps. Kenny has talked to Jenny Wheelock and she is willing to come to a meeting to talk to us about the layout of the land and what land is potentially available for recreational needs.

There being no further business to discuss, the meeting was adjourned at 7:25pm

The next advisory board meeting will be held at the Mulberry Recreation Center Multi-Purpose Room #2 on Monday, September 17, 2018, 6pm.

Fire Departments are often asked why we shut down traffic during MVAs (motor vehicle accidents), especially if it is only a fender-bender. The answer is really simple... SAFETY

Although, we realize it is an inconvenience to the traveling motorists, emergency personnel being hit be a passing motorists is a bigger inconvenience. Often times many passing motorists are curious or distracted by the emergency and aren't giving their full attention to their line of travel. In addition to the safety of emergency personnel, we must considered the safety of the those involved in the MVAs. They are often very distraught from the event and require a "safety zone" while receiving medical attention or interacting with law enforcement.

Please know that your inconvenience is our concern, but the safety of those involved is our priority. As firefighters, we have a state class which studies traffic flow and safety. We will always try to get traffic flowing as soon as it is safely possible.

We thank you in your patience, understanding, and insurance of everybody returning home to their families!!

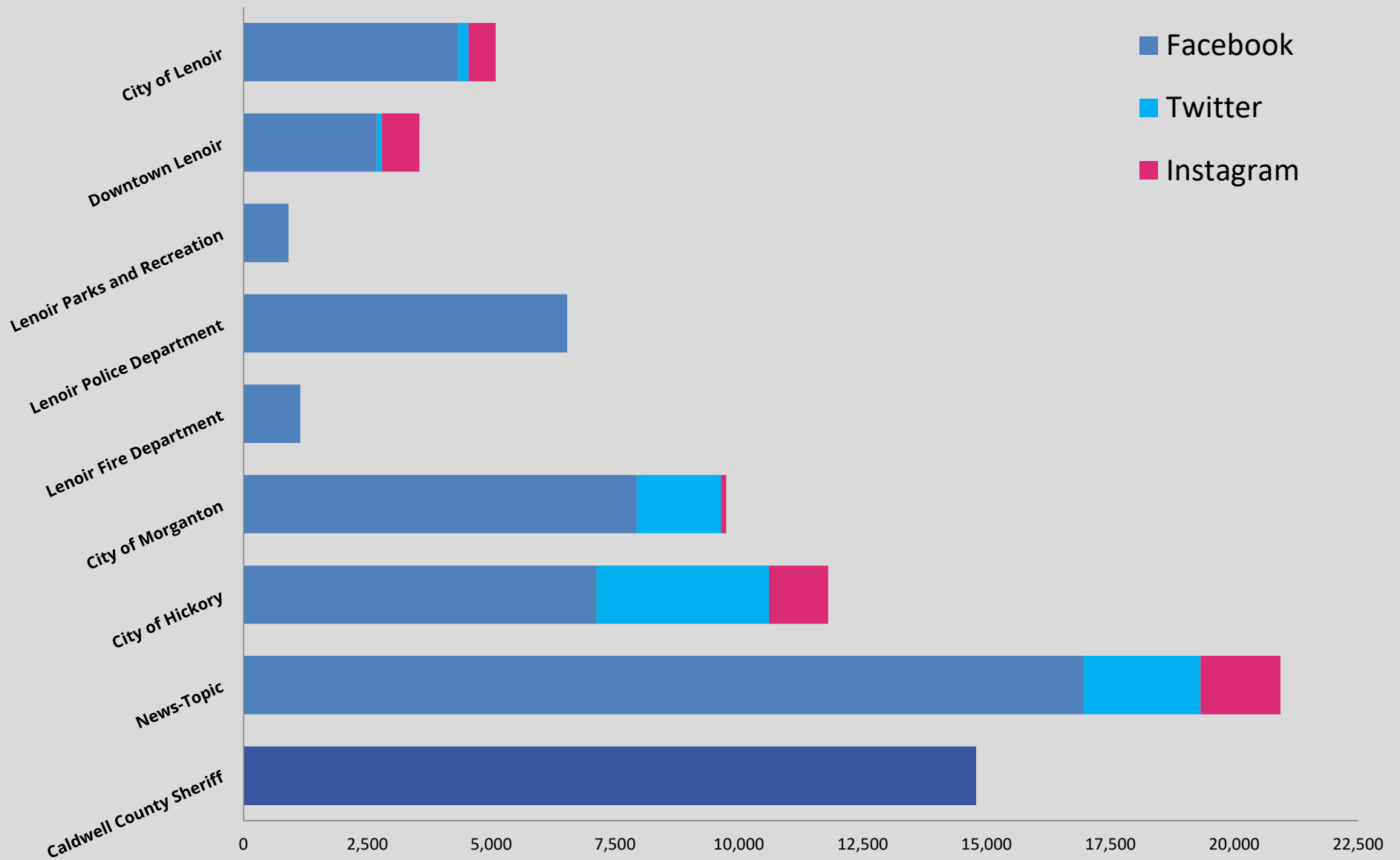

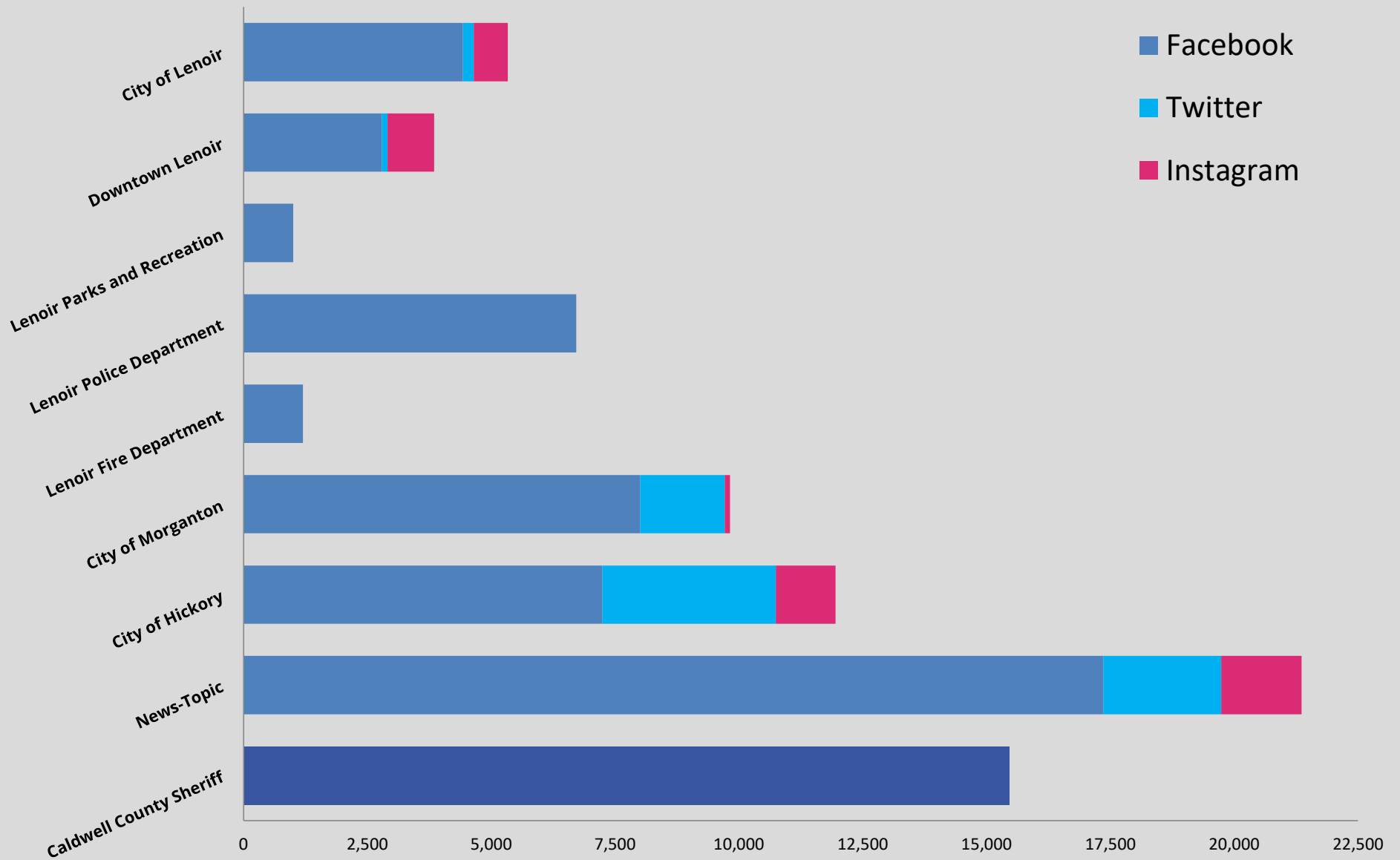
