I. Agenda Item: City Hall Façade and Windows Project

Background Information: The City of Lenoir received an allocation of \$200,000 in SCIF funding in early 2022. The City then contracted with the NC Main Street and Rural Planning Center in April of 2022 to create a proposal for the façade enhancement of the City Hall building and clock tower located at 801 West Ave, NW, Lenoir NC. This project scope included stucco repair, paint, signage, and window replacement which would meet historical district requirements.

The project was put out for public bid on August 1, 2022, with a closing date of August 26, 2022. No bids were received. The bid was readvertised on August 30, 2022 with a closing date of September 15, 2022. No bids were received during the readvertising window.

After consideration to the scope and discussion it was decided that the clock tower enhancements would move in a different direction and no longer be a part of the City Hall Façade Project. Due to not receiving any public bids staff has worked to acquire separate quotes for the window replacement and stucco repair and painting of the City Hall building.

Proposal includes all labor, materials, and equipment to complete painting and coatings as follows:

- All stucco/masonry surfaces on the front, back and sides of the entire building.
- All decorative wood windows on lower level only. All other windows are being replaced by the City.
- All decorative columns and accent bands will be painted along with the walls and will not be a distinct color.
- Metal support brackets at the front overhang.
- We did not include the clock tower or the fire escape stair tower.

General Scope of Work:

Cleaning - all exterior surfaces will be cleaned to remove mildew and other contaminants using mild chemicals and minimum 2500 psi from a pressure washer. We use the pressure to help aid in removal of failed coatings on all surfaces and to provide a good clean substrate for coating. The chemicals are mild and environmentally friendly and will not harm your plants or animals.

- *We did not include any pricing for water capture, containment or storm drain issues. If the City requires that we recapture or contain all the wash water and keep it from the storm drain, we will need to adjust our pricing. Nothing we use will harm the environment due to such low quantity, but we want to be sure all expectations are aligned.*

Prep - this step is critical to a lasting paint finish. Paint failure must be dealt with properly to have good longevity with the new coatings. Scraping and sanding of peeling areas will be completed. We will sand the peeling edges to a tight feathered edge. Any gaps, cracks or transitions will be filled/caulked with a premium urethane joint sealant. Metal items will be thoroughly prepared to SSPC SP3 Standards.

- Expansion Joints – all failing vertical expansion joints in masonry will be fully removed, new neoprene backer rod installed to proper depth, and new urethane joint sealant installed to proper width/depth ratio for joint size.
- Stucco/masonry repairs- all cracks and damaged areas will be probed for soundness and repaired as needed. We did not see any major repairs most were small cracks or minor delamination that can be repaired with stucco repair materials.
- *If we find any major damage once we start the prep process, we will notify the owner to get approval for any additional costs.*

Priming – all bare masonry surfaces will receive primer, as necessary. Sherwin Williams Loxon products will be used on masonry.

Painting – all surfaces will receive two full coats of material. Masonry surfaces will receive SW Loxon Self Cleaning acrylic coating or BASF C350 depending on availability. Either material will be applied at a rate of 150-200 sqft per gallon, per coat. Wood windows will be painted with two coats of SW Duration Acrylic coatings. Metal brackets will receive two coats of SW Acrolon 218 or PPG Amershield urethane coatings. Colors to match existing.

Other Work- All surfaces not being coated will be protected during the painting process. We will cover the ground and protect your investment.

Guarantee- 100% Satisfaction is our goal.

ACCESS: We will be utilizing large mechanical lifts. There will be some damage to any grass areas and there could be some damage to concrete. We will be as careful as possible but no matter what we do some damage could occur, so please budget in some dollars for repairs. There is simply no way to guarantee we will not damage the ground as the lifts will weigh 40,000 lbs. or more and CCI is not responsible for the damage. Our goal is to would be to keep the largest lift (80') on the asphalt in front of the building and that way we would not damage the concrete there may just be some areas where we need to be on the concrete.

During our work, the parking areas in front of the building will need to be closed for the public as we will need that space for the mechanical lifts. If there is a cost for this, please let us know so we can adjust pricing as needed. The duration would likely be less than 10 days.

Mr. Coffey,

Thank you for the opportunity to provide a proposal for the window replacement project at Lenoir City Hall. My proposal, outlined below, is based on the following assumptions:

- The Project will include the replacement of all existing windows on the second and third floors.
- Contractor will be responsible for window replacement, patch and repair of window openings, and clean-up.
- City staff will be responsible for preparing offices for construction – removing furniture, relocating office workers, etc.
- City staff will coordinate any necessary sidewalk and / or street closures necessary for construction.

The proposed scope of work includes:

- Field measurements of existing window openings.
- Coordination with window manufacturer.
- West Avenue façade: 8 windows on each floor. Double pane, insulated glass.
- Main Street façade: 6 windows on each floor. Double pane, insulated glass.
- Second floor windows will be double hung operation with a fixed transom above.
- Third floor windows will be double hung operation with no transom.
- Stairwell: 5 windows. Stairwell windows will be single pane, non-insulated glazing. Stair windows will be fixed, non-operable, units.

- Attic: 14 windows will be clad with painted metal, to match replacement windows. The existing, non-insulated glazing and aluminum frames will remain in place.
- All windows will be clear glazing (non Low-E) to meet historic guidelines.
- All windows & cladding will be dark bronze anodized aluminum. Note that this does not align with the RFP distributed by the City of Lenoir.

Based on the assumptions and scope of work outlined above, my design proposal is as follows:

Matthew Underwood made a motion to pay the costs of \$13,000 for the documentary of the clock seconded by Glenda Wilson, which was voted upon and passed unanimously.
